Social Enterprise Defined

- Unrestricted renewable income.
- Based upon current organizational assets.
- Usually generated through sales of programs, services or products.
- Use of sound business principles applied to the nonprofit process.
- Requires a shift from *charity-think* to *tax exempt business think*.

Social Enterprise Is Not

- Traditional fundraising, grant writing, special events, sponsorships, donations, etc.

Steps Required to Launch a Successful Social Enterprise

- Step 1 – Organizational Focus: Mission, Vision, Values, Goals, Stakeholders.
- Step 2 – Asset Inventory, Brainstorming and Objective Criteria.
- Step 3 – Market Research and Feasibility – The Customer(s).
- Step 4 – Market Research – The Competition.
- Step 5 – Costing, Financing.
- Step 6 – Sales Planning.
- Step 7 – Writing the Business Plan.
